

## GOALS

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### By the end of Confirmation Ministry, youths will

1. Confess Jesus Christ as Lord (Romans 10:9) and give an expression to this faith;
2. Have experienced and learned about God's unconditional love with Guides, parents and each other;
3. Have significant relationships with the youths and adults within their small group;
4. Have studied the Ten Commandments, Lord's Prayer, Apostles' Creed, and Sacraments, along with the explanations of these items in Martin Luther's Small Catechism.
5. Have begun to explore how God has shaped them for Christian ministry, specifically at St. John;
6. Have attended worship regularly;
7. Have served regularly in some capacity related to worship;
8. Have attended Sunday School regularly.

### By the end of Confirmation Ministry, parents of confirmation students will

1. Have learned how to be better parents to their adolescent;
2. Have significant relationships with other parents;
3. Have attended worship regularly with their adolescent.

## Confirmation Ministry

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## PURPOSE

The purpose of the St. John Confirmation Ministry is to engage the adolescent in a season of study, community building and reflection designed to help each youth embrace new life in Jesus Christ and make public affirmation of his or her baptism.

## CONTENT

On a three-year cycle, students will study: the Apostles' Creed and the Ten Commandments; the Lord's Prayer, Baptism and the Lord's Supper; and the Bible.

Additionally, through conversation, students will reflect on the teachings of the Christian faith and their application to daily living.

*Also, students will attend the annual retreat.*

This retreat is a highlight of the year for students. On the Martin Luther King, Jr. weekend in January, students and guides enjoy worship with the High School Band, skits by the High School Drama Team, large group teaching and small group conversations, along with free time, great food and lots of fun. On a three-year cycle, students explore "Friendship," "Boosting Self-Esteem," and "Media." When available (*usually as of the October*

*preceding the retreat*), retreat packets are accessible here.

The ninth graders conclude their confirmation journey by creating a personal **faith project** that they share at the Faith Project Presentation Reception in May/June. . The Rite of Confirmation is Pentecost Sunday.

## WEDNESDAY NIGHT

### **7:00-7:30 B.A.S.H.**

Students gather in large group each Wednesday night for worship, known as BASH (Big Awesome Spiritual Happening). Using various sensory aids, the teacher addresses the night's topic. Fun learning games and skits are presented by the High School BASH drama team. The High School Band "Shadow of the Cross" provides music.

### **7:30-8:30 Small Group Time**

Students gather with assigned small groups of 4-6 students and two Guides (at least one adult) who build caring communities through checking in with each other, discussing the session topic, and previewing or reviewing servant and fellowship events.

- Small Group Fellowship Events—2 per year
- Small Group Servant Events—2 per year
- Worship-related Service (acolytes, altar guild, greeters, ushers, readers, music, etc.)
- Regular Sunday School & worship attendance
- Participation in Youth Ministry events

### **For Parents**

- Involvement & assistance (Parent Meetings, retreat, confirmation reception, etc.)
- Ongoing two-way communication with Guides and Pastors



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
